From the President:

We have just returned from a wonderful and wet weekend of dancing at the Heart of the Smokies Square Up in Pigeon Forge, TN. I would like to thank all the Alabama dancers that attended this dance. What better representation and publicity for our dance family than to have an Alabama club, the Kurly Qs, win the attendance award at an out of state dance. We had a total of 47 Alabama dancers in attendance from clubs all over the state.

Since becoming President, we have tried to establish a line of communication between ASARDA and all our clubs. We began distributing manila envelopes through the ASARDA board, and back in October through club members. Included in the last packet was a <u>Club Profile Form</u> asking for a <u>contact person in each club</u> that we could mail the packets to in hopes that any information would be distributed and disseminated to the general club membership. We are also planning to mail a copy of the newsletter to each club using this club contact person. The profile form was on the backside of the club membership form. We specified that even if your club does not want to pay the \$10 yearly membership dues and join ASARDA, we would still like to have the club profile form with contact information returned. We became aware that some of these envelopes with information were still not making it to the clubs.

Also included in the last packet of information was a copy of the updated Alabama Traveler card (that is now a trifold) and the "Welcome" booklet for new square dancers. When your club prepares for graduation, please email me and we will send you free copies of the booklet for each graduate.

We have asked our members for two years to voluntarily agree to receive the newsletter by email, but we are still paying to mail out over 100 issues. As most of you probably realize, it takes 2 ½ members dues to cover the cost of mailing one members' newsletters. For this reason, the board voted at the Annual ASARDA meeting in August to discontinue mailing the newsletters as part of the \$10 annual ASARDA membership starting in 2019. In November, because of several members were asking to pay extra to receive the newsletter by mail, we decided to offer that as an option. It was announced in the December newsletter that any members wishing to continue to receive a printed copy of the newsletter could pay a \$10 yearly subscription



to cover the postage. Since we realize that most members were unaware of the change when they paid their 2019 membership dues, we have decided to continue mailing for this year to avoid a disruption and <u>discontinue</u> mailing starting in September (when the new membership year begins). The \$10 subscription will be available on the 2020 membership form.

Please remember to email any fliers or dance information, or updated club information to Jim Wolfe to be added to the ASARDA website at jimwolfe46@gmail.com. We try to keep the website as up to date as possible. If at any time you have questions or suggestions on anything pertaining to ASARDA, please feel free to email me.

Alabama's Bid for the 72nd National Square Dance Convention in 2023

THANK YOU to all clubs and associations that sent us a **Letters of Support** for our **Bid Book**. We will soon be mailing the books to the National Executive Committee with the details of the awesome features Mobile has to offer for an outstanding national convention. Thank you also to the dancers that came to our presentation at the Kurly Qs. For those of you not present, we previewd many exciting things! Since **Mobile** is

known as the "Home of the Mardi Gras" and known for their unique New Years Eve Moon Pie drop, we incroporated both aspects for promoting our national convention. At our registration tables, we will have Mardi Gras beads and Moon Pies as giveaways. Other dancers can wear the beads to show their support, and who doesn't love a free moon pie?

For those of you planning to attend the 68th NSDC in Atlanta, please join us at both the <u>Bid Presentation</u> on Friday morning, the



<u>Parade of States</u> on Saturday evening, and the <u>After Party</u> Saturday night! We need the support of all of our dancers to be as LOUD and PROUD as we can.

We will **present our bid** to host the 72nd NSDC in Mobile to the National Executive Committee **Friday morning at 9am** (Indiana will present their bid to host the 71st NSDC in Evanasville first). We will have a reserved seating area right up front for all of our Alabama dancers – our cheer/rally section! We hope you will come join us and help throw Moon Pies to the audience.

Saturday night at the **Parade of States**, Alabama will not walk in first (alphabetically) as usual, instead we will walk in next to last as a bidding state. The parade line up will be: all the states (aphabetically), followed



by other countries, followed by future NSDCs: 69th Washington; 70th Mississippi; Indiana bidding for the 71st, Alabama bidding for the 72nd, and the hosting state Georgia will enter last. **We hope to go over-the-top with a Mardi Gras style Parade as we enter.** We will have some of the **Azalea Trail Maids** (Ambassadores of the City of Mobile; pictured right), we will have a **Mardi Gras King & Queen** (courtesy of the Belles and Bouys in Biloxi; pictured right), we will have a couple of **costumed**



characters (pictured left), and hopefully all of our dancers walking with us will be wearing bright colors, Mardi Gras beads & other assessories, and some of us plan to carry **Mardi Gras umbrellas** (next page), and all **throwing Moon Pies**! Its going to be a ton of fun, so invite everyone you know to walk in with us – the more walking, the livelier and more noticable!





We will Parade in to the ballroom where the **closing ceremonies** will be held. At the end of the closing ceremonies, the **award of the bid will be announced**. (Indiana for the 71st, should they be awarded their bid, and Alabama for the 72nd, should we be awarded the bid). After the announcement, everyone will move to the dance hall next door for the "**Celebration dance**". Indiana will have their song, then **our song will be "Sweet Home Alabama"!** We hope to have all our Alabama dancers on the floor for this tip!

Immediately after the award of the bid (if we are awarded), we will set up 2 registration tables and begin selling registrations for our convention. One will be located near the square dance halls, and the other in the adjoining hotel where the round dance halls are located. If you are attending, please be sure to register that night! We will be drawing one winner from the registrations received Saturday night for a Carnival Carribean Cruise for two! (courtesy of Visit Mobile)



We will co-host the **Saturday night After Party** with Indiana (if we/they are awarded our bids). So again, we would like to have all dancers on the floor for this.

As you can see we plan to have a lot of excitement going on in Atlanta! We need evreyone attending to take part in these festivites because we only have one change to make our first impression! Hopefully everyone

that sees <u>our enthusiasm</u> will want to "*Come to Alabama and Dance*"! If you have not yet registered, but want to be part of the fun, please register soon. Hotel rooms are filling up and if you wait and pay at the door, the cost will be \$75 per person.

Have you ever heard of a Mardi Gras umbrella? I hadnt until recently. Several of us have already made our own to carry in the Parade of States Saturday night in Atlanta. We will also use them in the next 3 Parade of States at NSDCs. There are several examples of styles on the internet, and a sample is pictured (left). We would love to have more, so if you are planning to walk in the Parade of States, you don't want to be left out!

Facebook, really?


So I admit it. I'm old. So when Jim became President of Prattville Promenaders we realized everyone


we knew was also old. So how in the world were we going to grow the club...that was the question of the day.


I do believe that using Facebook has helped our club grow. More importantly what has helped the club grow is a welcoming

ASARDA EDUCATION

"SELLING" SQUARE DANCE TO NEW PEOPLE

Our marketing subject for this month is SELLING the most important part of marketing the benefits of square-dancing - FUN, FITNESS & FRIENDSHIP SET TO MUSIC!

We will cover the common mistakes most square dancers make as they talk to a prospect who called them in response to one of their ads or publicity efforts.

The first mistake is calling your new dancer dances LESSONS! The word 'lessons' imply a class room setting, etc. and is interpreted as a negative experience. Please call them what they are - new dancer dances - because that is what they are in the real world. A good square dance teacher-caller will have the new dancers dancing to a popular song within ten minutes of being on the floor for the first time. A caller from Wausau, Butch Danielski, is an expert at this. He has the rare talent of being able to call a singing call with only the calls that he has taught within the first ten minutes of being on the floor. His emphasis with the new dancers is



to have loads of fun learning how to dance. Each new dancer dance has to be a fun experience for your new dancers!

The second mistake most square dancers make when talking to a prospect is that they talk too much. The secret is to get the prospect to talk what is important to them - not what is important to you. Often, the best way to answer a question from the prospect is to ask a relevant question.

Your job is to truthfully answer their questions and concerns with as few words as possible as you try to determine what their HOT BUTTONS are, namely what is their desire and what is important to them. The most common need of your prospects is the desire for a positive social experience! Take a close look at your club dances and you will see that the social aspect of your dance is as important if not more important than the actual dancing.

Your goal is to get their name, phone number, email address and street address (for your Prospect Dancer Data) and to close the sale by inviting them to your next new dancer dance or your club dance to see the fun that happens at your club dances.

The third mistake that most square dancers make when talking to a prospect over the phone is that they don't know when to stop selling. Again, most square dancers talk too much when talking to a prospect. When you realized that they are "sold" you switch into the brief information mode.

The fourth mistake that most square dancers make when talking to a prospect is that they are not prepared to answer the questions coming from the prospect. Here are a few of the more common questions and comments that you will receive from your prospects:

- My husband or wife does not like to dance.
- I have two left feet.
- Is square dancing hard to learn?
- How long does it take to learn to square dance?
- Do I have to wear those old-fashioned square dance costumes?
- Can we bring our kids to the dances?

I am sure that you can think of more possible questions and comments. The key to successful selling is to be prepared to answer the prospect's questions and concerns. You will not be able to perceive all expected questions and comments. For those questions you will have to "wing it" but always TELL THE TRUTH.
